

**PRESS RELEASE**

Karachi, March 31: Administrator Karachi, Sindh governments Spokesman Barrister Murtaza Wahab on Thursday said that Prime Minister Imran Khan has no right to be in power as he lost majority in the National Assembly.

"Imran Khan's government has lost its majority. The opposition alliance now has more than 175 members, while 172 members are needed to form a government, the Administrator said this while addressing a crowded press conference here at Sindh Assembly Building

Administrator Barrister Murtaza Wahab said that no-confidence motion has been submitted and now it voting should be done without any delay.

"The PTI wants to divert attention from various excuses but the time has come for them to panic," he added.

He said that Ali Wazir is a MNA but Speaker National Assembly did not issue his production order is tantamount to depriving him of his rights. "When a person is a member of the assembly, he has full right to come to the assembly. When Syed Khurshid Shah was in custody, the same Sindh government had declared Sindh House a sub-jail," he added.

In response to a question, the Administrator said that there was no agreement with Muttahida Qaumi Movement-Pakistan regarding new administrative units.

Barrister Murtaza Wahab said that Administrator Karachi should be from Karachi who can work better for the city.

"My party had appointed me to this post. So far I have not received any instruction to resign from. I am performing my duties as per the instructions of the party," he added.

He said that the main objective of PPP and MQM is not to get big positions but to work for the betterment of the city and the province.

"We want to establish a lasting relationship and hopefully we will succeed in that. Pakistan Peoples Party and MQM want development of the city, development of the province and if both the parties work together, better results will come," said the Administrator.

He was of the view that if Imran Khan has any kind of letter then why is it hidden in his pocket. He said that In the last three and a half years, Pakistan has gone into decline instead of growth, inflation has made life difficult for people, unemployment has risen, people have become homeless.

Barrister Murtaza Wahab said that the country is in debt and electricity, gas, petrol, flour, sugar are out of reach of the people.

He said that flour and sugar mafia has robbed the people with both hands.
